Our Indonesian team joined forces with the government agencies, local NGOs, universities and many other partners to provide a space for **almost 4000 people** to come together and hold respectful and argument-based discussions on the topics that matter the most for them. It was the third time Indonesia held their Opinion Festival, and in 2023, they organised it both online and offline. Our whole team is extremely proud of our Indonesian team and the many volunteers who made this happen!

Not all steps to defend democracy have to be connected to massive movements and big projects. We safeguard our democracy in many ways. In routine and small actions, as well as big cooperation projects. In this issue of our Annual Report, you'll get a glimpse of some of our highlights – big and small. Both of these matter.

Established in 2015 in Estonia, we have now gained international momentum and years of experience.


What do we offer?

The Platform Revamp

We've been busy implementing the designs for a **new look and feel**, improved user interface and smoother user experience for our participation platform, Citizen OS, in collaboration with our longstanding UX-UI design partners, DUX.

We're currently usability testing and bug-catching, working to have the first phase of our redesign ready for launch this Spring. The initial launch will be a much improved version of our existing platform, with similar features but set out with a refreshed visual identity and better usability for both leaders and participants. Throughout the year, we'll be **gradually rolling out new features** and further improvements, such as the addition of an **ideation feature for gathering ideas**. Through user research with our target groups and organisations – including local governments, local communities, professional bodies, political parties and youth organisations – we'll be prioritising our users' needs to make sure the platform works as smoothly as possible for their participation processes, with every new rollout.



Democracy Defenders Accelerator January 2023–January 2024, international


Democracy Defenders Accelerator (DDA) was a ten-month hands-on programme where participants learned how to design and deliver civic engagement projects and practise participatory leadership skills – through both the running of real-life projects and working on project ideas. The entire learning process was supported by mentors and facilitators. The topics of the projects concerned women's rights, accessibility to public transportation for disabled people, climate change and media education, among other issues.

Democracy Defenders Network November 2023–ongoing, international (online)



The Democracy Defenders Network is our new global community for activists who have taken part in Citizen OS civic engagement programmes, and like-minded individuals working to promote democratic values.

This volunteer-driven participatory network aims to help build skills, foster cooperation and launch new projects to enhance democratic participation and boost the impact of civil society leaders across the world.

The initiative is born from the ten-month immersive **Democracy Defenders Accelerator** programme.



Who is this programme for?

Activists.

Civil society activists, both individuals or representatives of groups or organisations.

Participants & partners.

Participants, partners and volunteers of initiatives run by the Citizen OS Foundation.

Researchers.

Researchers who are focused on democratic participation.

In this phase, we are most eager to welcome network members between the ages of 18–35. The core team is led by nine voluntary core team members. Network members are welcome to join the core team.



Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Programme: Artificial Intelligence for Sustainable Societies (AISS) 2023–2029, in Estonia, Finland and Portugal, and online

Citizen OS joined the Erasmus Mundus Joint Master's Programme (EMJM) in **Artificial Intelligence for Sustainable Societies**, which focuses on sustainability, artificial intelligence and data-driven decisions, as well as participatory design methods to engage citizens.

The programme is designed together with three universities: Tallinn University, School of Digital Technologies; Tampere University, Faculty of Information Technology and Communication Sciences; and Lusófona University, Faculty of Natural Sciences, Engineering. In addition, societal NGOs and industry partners such as Citizen OS, Estonian Anthropocene Center NGO, Lääne-Harju municipality, Inspirators!

In 2024, we will lead a 6 ECTS course where we tackle open society values and possibilities for transforming public life, developing critical thinking and argumentation skills, leveraging Artificial Intelligence, Open Source Software and Open Data in engaging people and making data-driven decisions.

Development Leap of NGOs April–July 2023 in Estonia

2023 was also the year of strategic planning! We were selected to take part in the "Development Leap of NGOs" programme which was funded by the **National Foundation for Civil Society** in the amount of 4000 EUR.

The aim of the project was to explore and analyse the possible development of the two main activities of Citizen OS and to define a roadmap for their implementation over the next 3 years.

We explored:

- The possibilities of adding artificial intelligence to the existing platform.
- The role of public web discussion organisers in society.

Five focus group interviews and five individual interviews took place during this time, with a total of 36 people providing their input.

These consultations and discussions were formed into work plan objectives and now guide us in our planning.



Open Governance Partnership Global Summit 5-7 September in Estonia



The past year brought thousands of open governance leaders and enthusiasts to Tallinn, Telliskivi Creative City, right into our "hood" where our office is located.

We took part in the official programme of the OGP Summit by running a **workshop "Digital tools for civic engagement"** to hundreds of participants and opened our office as part of the **NGO Open Doors Initiative**. The workshop was organised together with our good partners Kristina Mänd and Kristina Reinsalu from the <u>E-Governance</u> <u>Academy</u> (eGA) and Maarja-Leena Saar from the <u>Estonian</u> <u>Cooperation Assembly</u>.

The Summit focused on open government in the digital age, the potential of technology to make governance and policy-making more transparent and accountable, and the preservation of democracy.



Strengthening Democracy – Our Projects in Indonesia

Indonesian Opinion Festival 2023 24–29 October 2023, in Indonesia and online

The third Indonesian Opinion Festival brought together almost 4000 people to discuss how to improve democratic participation in the country. In contrast to the previous years, this time the democracy festival was held both online and offline in three different regions – Bali, Central Java, and Aceh.

The Indonesia Opinion Festival 2023 is organised by Citizen OS Indonesia, in partnership with Indorelawan and Gerakan Mari Berbagi and supported by the Indonesian Ministry of Communication and Informatics. This 2023 event has successfully involved 3947 participants in total, with more than 200 volunteers taking part in organising it.

Youth Engagement Programme 2023 Banda Aceh June–August 2023, in Indonesia

Continuing from the successful launch of the <u>Youth</u> <u>e-Engagement Programme</u> in 2021, Citizen OS Indonesia conducted the Youth Engagement Programme 2023 in Banda Aceh City, Aceh Province, Indonesia.

In the Youth Development Index (2021) report submitted by the Indonesian Ministry of Youth and Sports Affairs, Aceh was reported to be one of the lowest ranking provinces in Indonesia in terms of employment opportunities, youth participation and youth leadership. This programme aims to **empower and increase youth participation** through training for leaders of local youth community organisations. 118 young people applied and 54 young Banda Aceh community leaders were selected to participate in the training. The participants led 13 social projects, which focused on environmental issues, sexual violence, entrepreneurship opportunities and other social issues in Aceh. With this, they **created real social impact in their community**.

The initiative was organised by Citizen OS Indonesia in collaboration with Banda Aceh City Youth & Sports Agency and Australia Awards Indonesia. The programme is supported by the Aceh Province Government, Banda Aceh City Government, PT PEMA and Bank Aceh.



- With the <u>Network of Estonian Non-Profit</u> <u>Organisations</u> (NENO), the <u>e-Governance Academy</u> and <u>Citizen Initiative Portal</u> we worked together to design the programme and a workshop for the <u>Open</u> <u>Government Partnership Summit 2023</u>. We were also

part of the Open Government Associations Roundtable and helped to shape the pre-event. More about this can be found under our projects section of this Annual Report.

• Domus Dorpatensis Center for the Development of Democracy partnered with us to promote the scientific understanding and research of the constitutional role of the Estonian Parliament. Citizen OS, together with many other democracy innovators in Estonia, contributed to considering Parliament's constitutional role and the status of the investigation and jointly set expectations for future work. As a result of the Parliamentary Research Development Process, a document summarising the process and results was published. The document is available here.



Our Funding in 2023

The Citizen OS Foundation is a non-profit organisation which is funded from **civic society funds** and donations. We are very grateful to have stable financial support from our **philanthropist funder** and other private donors.

Investing to support a strong democracy!

- We received a 54,253.80 EUR application grant from the <u>Active Citizens Fund</u> to develop a 10-month civil society leadership programme for young activists from around the world. Read more about the <u>Democracy Defenders</u> <u>Accelerator here</u>.
- Thanks to the Active Citizens Fund and the <u>Open Estonia</u> <u>Foundation</u>, our team has had the chance to participate in several events related to democracy. Participation was funded in the event "The Role of Civil Society in Countering Disinformation and Promoting Media Literacy" in Bulgaria and in the Norwegian Democracy Festival "Arendalsuka".



- We were approved for support with 3533.68 EUR by the National Foundation for Civil Society as part of the programme "Preparatory Call for Proposals 2023 for the Development Leap of NGOs". This enabled us to carry out focus interviews with 36 people – civic society activists, government officials, community leaders, technology experts, researchers and political decision makers. Based on these consultations and strategic decisions, strategic focus topics for our work plan were chosen. Learn more about the outcomes here.
- We were given 360,000 EUR in private donations from the philanthropist funder to develop and improve the <u>Citizen</u> <u>OS platform</u>.

We are extremely grateful to our philanthropic funder, who believes that what we do helps to innovate and advocate democracy in a world, where democracy has been declining in many ways.


